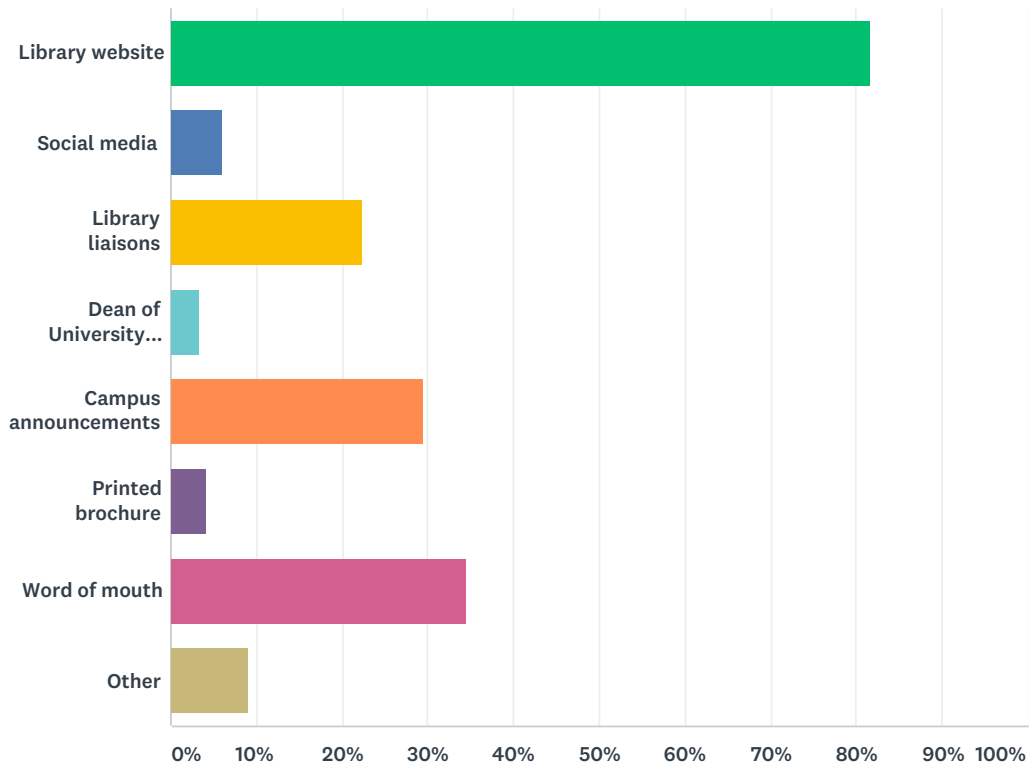


## Q1 2. Awareness of Library Services How do you find out about library services? (Select all that apply)

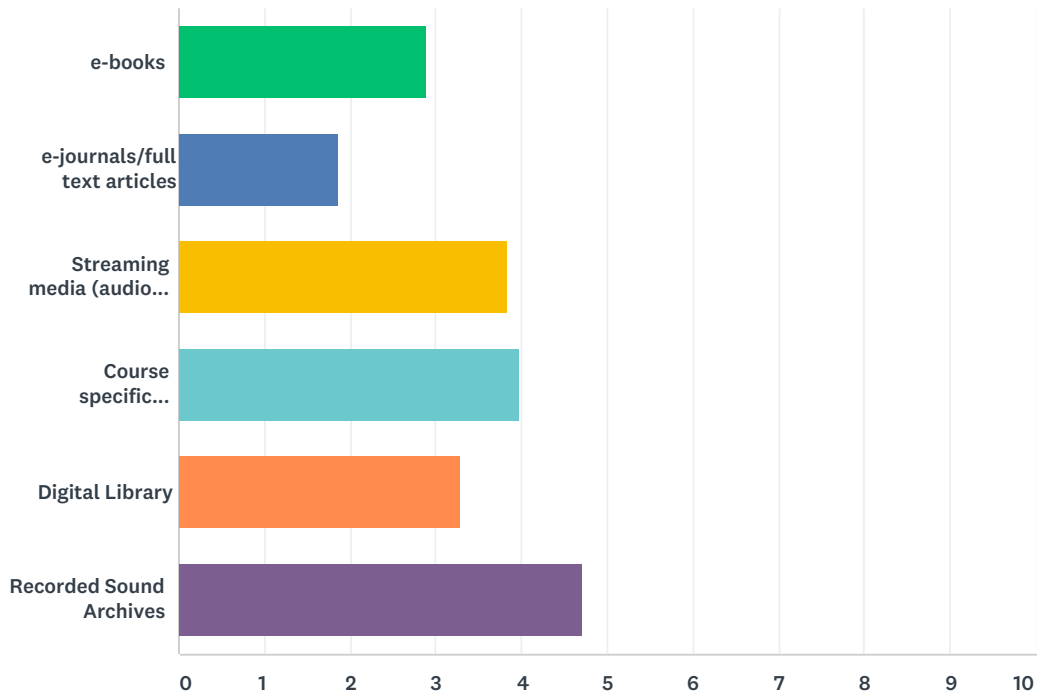

9	The academic instructional & research landscape of the 21st century continues to rely heavily on electronic delivery systems for gathering and analysis of materials as well as the dissemination of knowledge. As such, the role of our libraries on our campuses continues to alter, shift, change and grow. Truly, technology has created a more fluid way in which learning occurs and other forms of engagement happen. Therefore, it is crucial for our university libraries residing on 'all' campuses to have available the latest computers, software, 3D printing/ print services, and other technological equipment in support of student and faculty research. As the needs and requirements of university libraries continue to be re-imagined, it is vital that with any changes that the libraries may be required to make, that at the forefront of said changes, the ways & means in which the 21st century students learn and process information be taken in to account. So what do I mean & what does this entail.....? This means acquiring funding (external grants and donations) that allows for creating and maintaining quiet study spaces/rooms/pods; designing and designating collaborative learning areas for team- research; and the construction of specialty professional rooms for the recording, practice and evaluation of presentations and/or speechmaking. These "Way-making" gathering stations can become students' central communal areas that support their preparation for life beyond the academic borders. 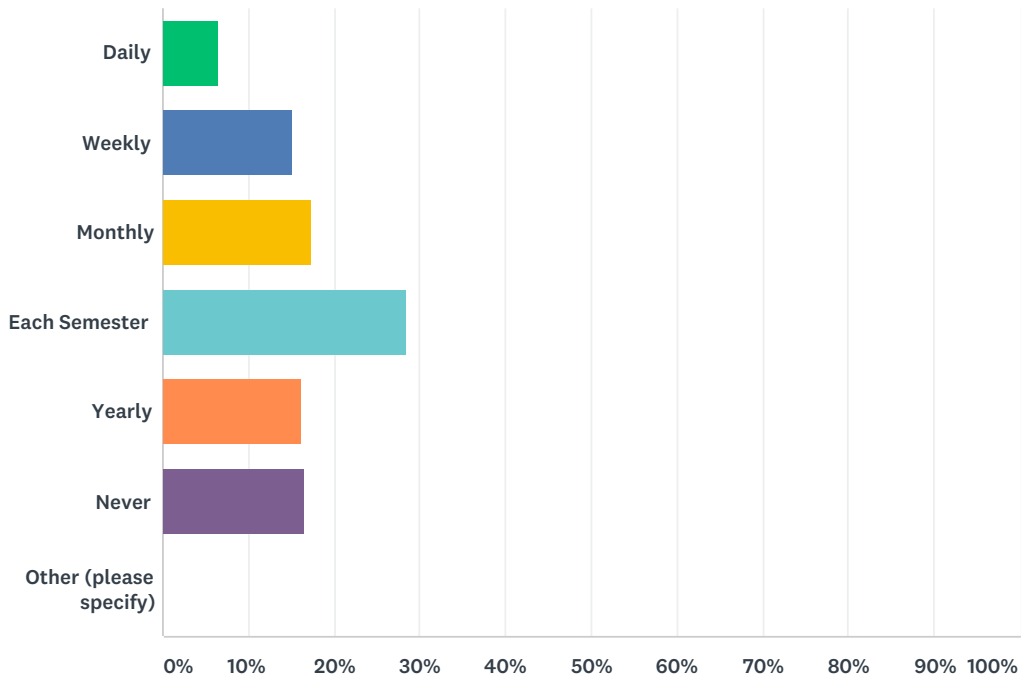

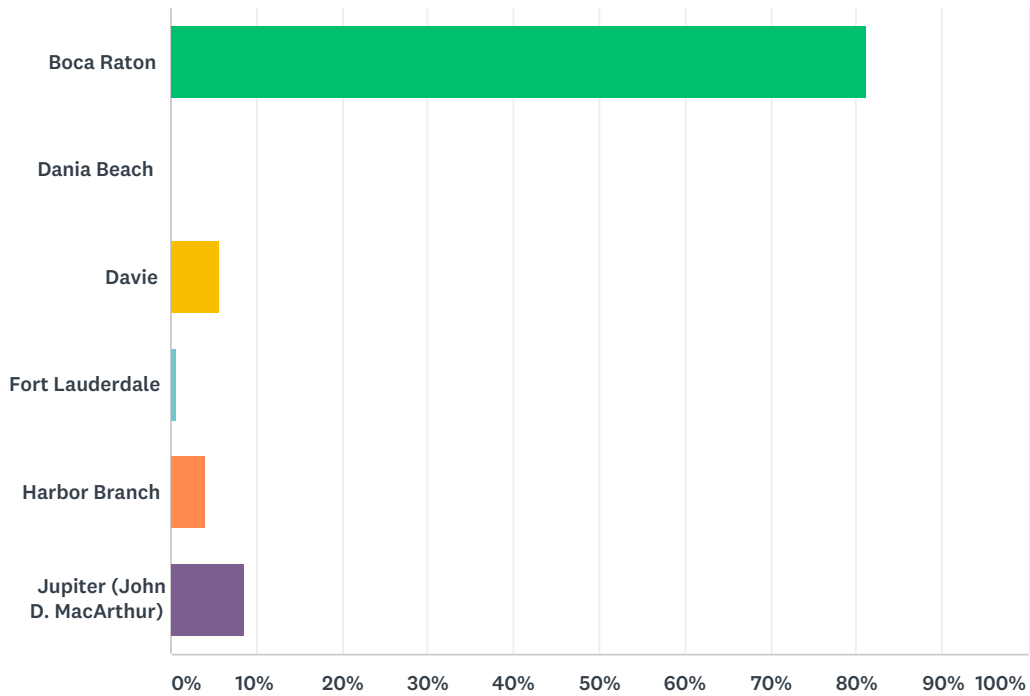

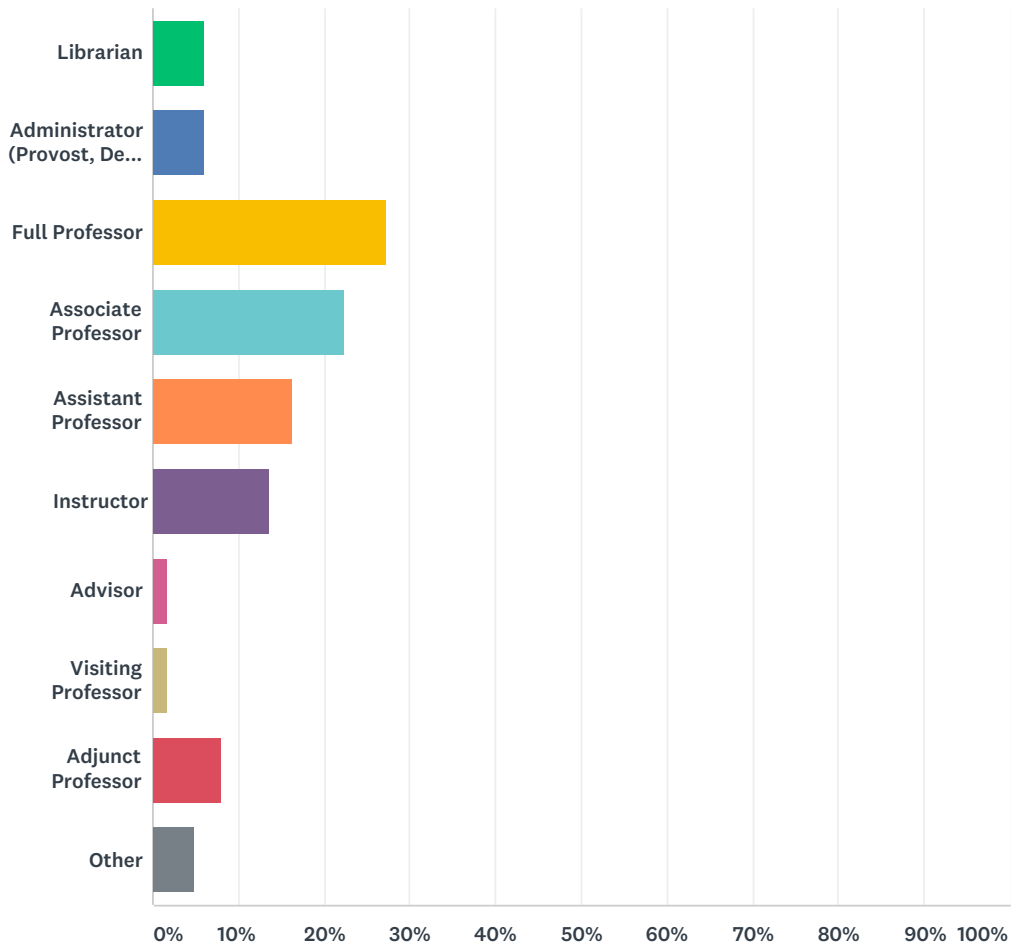

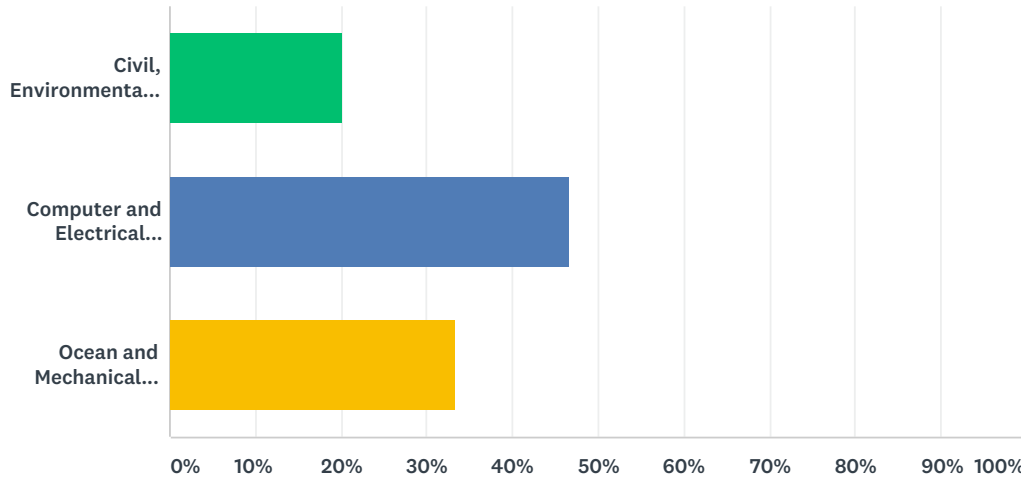

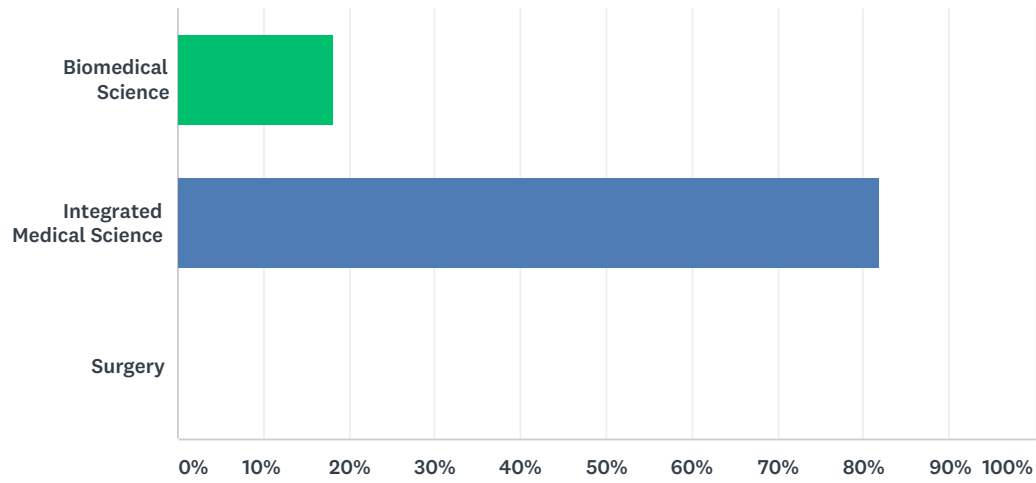

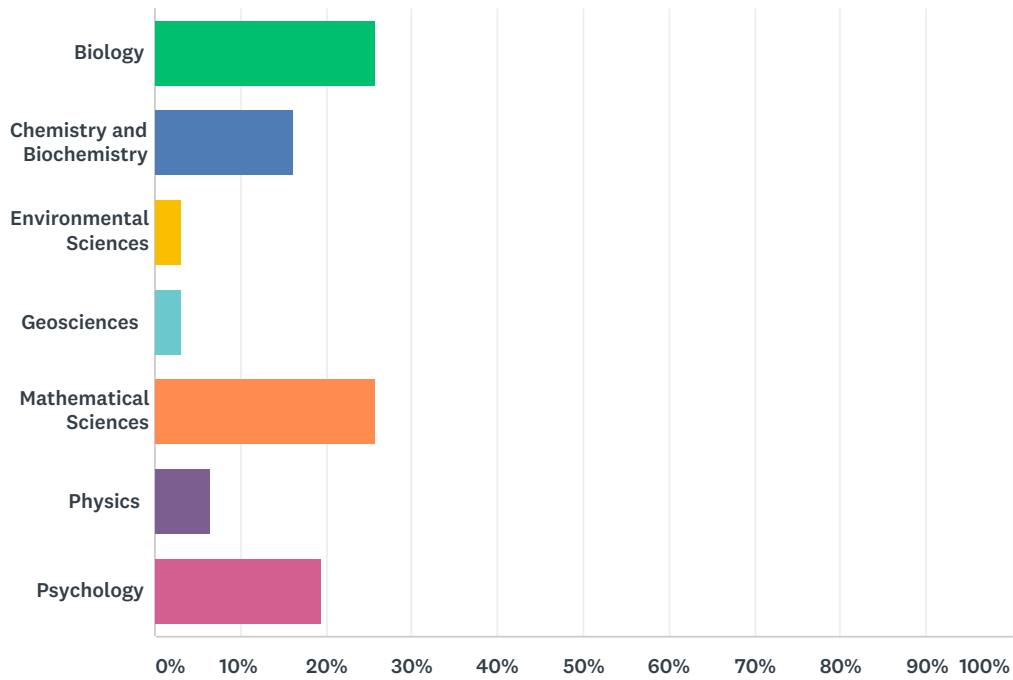
